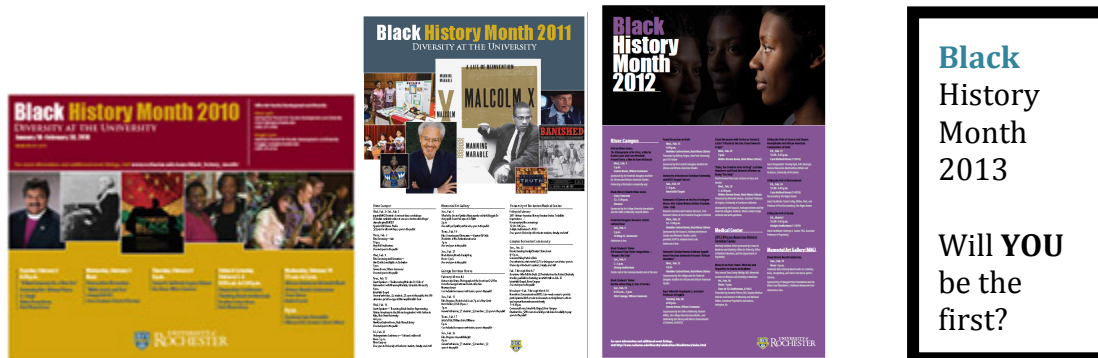


2013 BLACK HISTORY MONTH POSTER CONTEST

The Black History Month (BHM) calendar planning committee is for the first time this year opening up a poster design competition for students. The poster is an effort of the Office for Faculty Development and Diversity (OFDD), the Office of Minority Student Affairs (OMSA), and the College Diversity Roundtable (CDR). The posters are used to promote events around the University during the month of February that celebrate diversity and inclusion.

This year's competition challenges all interested students to design a poster that best expresses black culture, history, politics, and diasporic roots.



CRITERIA

- To enter, you must be an undergraduate student at the University of Rochester
- Only one entry per student will be accepted
- We will not accept any poster, which we deem to have offensive content
- Each entry becomes the property of the BHM committee
- Student designers retain the creative and production rights for their own work

AWARD

- One poster will be chosen
- The winner will be awarded a gift and a certificate
- The winner will be recognized during the VIP reception of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemorative Address
- Recognition through University publications

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

Artwork can be submitted in any artistic medium, however the minimum width for any studio or digital artwork is 11 inches wide. If your work is digital, please submit your image in .jpeg or .tiff format at a resolution of 300 dpi.
