

HUMAN SUBJECTS APPROVAL

SPONSOR	IRB APPROVAL REQUIREMENT
AIR FORCE OFFICE OF SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH (AFOSR)	Just-in-Time
AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY	IRB certification must be submitted with application or within 60 days of submission
AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION	Just-in-Time
ARMY RESEARCH OFFICE (ARO)	Just-in-Time
CENTER FOR DISEASE CONTROL	Just-in-Time
DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (DOED)	IRB certification must be submitted with the application or proposal or by such later date as may be prescribed by the program to which the application or proposal is submitted.
DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY (DOE)	Required at time of application
DORIS DUKE FOUNDATION	Just-in-Time
ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON	Does not request any information at the proposal stage, but when awarded - the institutional official signs an agreement that includes a statement that if human subjects are used, the organization will comply with the CFR Part 50 and the DHHS regulations.
NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH (NIH)	Just-in-Time
NATIONAL KIDNEY FOUNDATION	IRB certification must be submitted with application or within 120 days of submission
NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION (NSF)	All projects involving human subjects must either (1) have approval from the institution's IRB before issuance of an award or (2) identify the applicable exemption. If the IRB number (or exemption) is not included with the proposal submission, then theoretically the program officer will contact the PI to obtain prior to Division Director concurrence. If for whatever reason that step does not occur, then it will definitely occur prior to the award of the proposal by the Division of Grants & Agreements
NEW YORK STATE	Just-in-Time
OFFICE OF NAVAL RESEARCH (ONR)	Just-in-Time
SUSAN KOMEN BREAST CANCER FOUNDATION	Just-in-Time

"Just-in-Time" means that IRB approval is required prior to award, but not at the time of proposal submission. Sponsor notification and practices will differ and individual sponsor guidelines should be referenced.
