# College Degree Requirements

- Three Academic Divisions:
- ...Humanities
- .....Social Sciences
- .....Natural Sciences, Math and Engineering
  (Engineering majors have modified requirements)



## College Degree Requirements

- 128 credit hours (some engineering programs 128+)
- Primary Writing Requirement a grade of "C" or better is required (WRT 105/WRT 105E/WRT 105A+B) (the only automatic exemption is ENG 200 or HON 295 with a B or better from MCC)
- Rochester Curriculum based on YOUR interests: Students complete a formal set of courses in each of the three academic divisions with a "C" average



## College Degree Requirements

- A formal set of courses is a <u>major, minor, or cluster</u>
- A major requires 12-15 classes; a minor 5-8
- Clusters are authorized sets of three courses that are linked in some way
- There are over 250 authorized clusters in the Cluster Search Engine
- No student, including transfer students, can use courses taken elsewhere to meet Cluster requirements

### Your Transfer Credit Evaluation

- Preliminary evaluations are generally emailed with acceptance letters
- Final evaluations will be completed upon receipt of a "final" transcript (Deadline to submit is February 15<sup>th</sup>)
- For elective credit that could not be evaluated, or for major/minor credit, see faculty member noted on the <u>Authorized Signature list</u>
- For courses to be used toward a major or minor, departmental approval is required. Use Course Approval Form (see folder)

### Registration for spring courses

- Course schedule and course descriptions are available <u>online</u> only
- If you haven't already registered for courses you should today
- You will need your NetID and password or UID and PIN- <u>Registrar's website</u>



### Registration for spring courses

- The typical course load is four 4-credit courses per semester
- Students enrolling in labs, music lessons, dance classes, music ensembles, etc. often exceed 16 credits
- More than 19 credits in a semester is considered an overload. Overloads are generally not recommended in your *first* semester. (please see official Overload policy in the Advising Handbook)



## Adding and Dropping Courses

- Online registration add/drop until Tuesday, Jan. 30<sup>th</sup>
- After Tuesday, Jan. 30<sup>th</sup>, course adds and drops are handled on paper drop/add forms
- Once online registration ends, students in Class of 2020, 2021 and 2022 need Undergraduate advisor's signatures on all drop/add forms.
- All HAJIM students need their advisor's signature as well as the Department stamp throughout their program (even after they declare their major)



## Important Deadlines

- Last day to ADD or DROP/DELETE a course is Tuesday, February 13<sup>th</sup>
- Last day to WITHDRAW from a class (with a W on your record) is Tuesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>
- Students may declare the S/F option (Satisfactory/ Fail). The professor reports a grade and an "S" is recorded on the record if the grade is D- or higher. An "F" is recorded if the grade is E. (Can't use S/F for major, minor, cluster)
- Deadline for FIRST SEMESTER students to declare S/F is Tuesday, April 24<sup>th</sup>
