Classes

- CASC 175 Global Citizen Advanced Seminar
- This course guides students through further exploration of what it means to be a global citizen. Designed to foster personal and professional development through critical selfreflection and exploration of intercultural experiences globally and locally. Students will demonstrate the knowledge, skills, and awareness of a global citizen through a capstone project of their own design that will create positive change in the world. Prerequisites: CASC 170 or CASC 120.

Medallion Leadership Society

A group of students dedicated to leadership. The society educates their peers to realize their leadership potential and become engaged members of the campus and surrounding communities, in an effort to achieve positive social change. Members in the society will participate in committees, have opportunities to meet with deans, and plan leadership programs for the Office of the Dean of Students (ODOS).
