The College Teaching, Learning, Technology Roundtable is an organization that is based on the national TLT Group (American Association for Higher Education) - a non-profit organization whose mission is to motivate and enable institutions and individuals to improve teaching and learning with technology, while helping them cope with continual change.

What does the CTLTR do?

The CTLTR meets on a regular basis during the academic year to discuss various technology initiatives and services. Act as a sounding board for new teaching and learning processes and procedures
