- Gave a presentation: "Diversity Abroad: A Look at the National Dialogue"
- Not a lot of good data about the diversity of students participating in study abroad programs nationally
- 2007 first Study Abroad expo in January highlighted the need for more outreach
- Presented a timeline of significant research/documents addressing underrepresentation in study abroad programs
- FFFF- Faculty, Fear, Family, Finances all contribute
- Diversity.com and Gilman Scholarships pivotal programs
- Students shared their opinions as to what some barriers might be at UR
 - Not market well in previous years
 - o Students heavily involved in student groups and organizations can't spare the time
 - Some students plan either too early or too late could SA reach out?
 - SA elections in the spring- can't be elected and go away in the fall
 - Leadership positions in SA can be a barrier
 - Many minority students are math and science majors and have strict schedules/requirements
 - o Perceived financial barrier
 - Peer to peer mentoring could be a solution, as could major advising
 - o Process to arrange study abroad is very time consuming
 - Students from low socio-economic status are very academically focused and may see it as an impediment to pre-professional programs.
 - Could be a very foreign concept for students and their families if they are the first member of the family to go to college.
