Virtual EMS Tips & Tricks

Did you know Virtual EMS users can find the reservation ID for your reservation request prior to the confirmation email? Although it is strongly encouraged to submit a reservation request far enough in advance that you will have time to receive the ID before submitting, sometimes the date sneaks up sooner than you realize! Once you submit your reservation request, select "My Events" on the left hand side of the screen, then select "Reservations" at the top. You can now see all of your reservation request, their ID numbers, and their current statuses! By selecting a reservation on this page, you can see all the recurrence under one reservation ID (if there are recurrances). Don't forget to cancel any reservations you are no longer using/will no longer be using in order to clear up space for other student organizations who might be looking!

As a reminder, all Virtual Green Form submissions require 2-3 business days for processing.

They cannot be processed in 24 hours. Thanks for your adherence to these timelines.

2023 Student Organization Annual Review (SOAR)

All College Student Organizations are evaluated through the Student Organization Annual

Review (SOAR). The self-report for student organizations will open by mid-November. A

separate e-mail will be shared with student leaders once the self-report form opens. The

deadline for this year's self-report will be 11:59 p.m. Sunday, January 7th.

Only one self-report can be submitted per organization and your entire executive board must

be involved in completion of the self-report. This is not something that should be completed by

one executive member. The period under review is January 2023 through December 2023.

The Administration & Review Committee (ARC) will be holding SOAR information sessions on



Individual Travel Waiver Tag - Now Visible to Officers!

Student organizations can now check their own roster as far in advance of your trip as you would like. As a reminder, all organizations traveling more than 25 miles off campus are required to submit a roster that will be checked to ensure all attendees have a completed Individual Travel Waiver. Officers can now check their member list in advance to see who has completed their travel waiver for this academic year to help speed up the travel approval process. The Tags will be updated once per week on Wednesdays.

To view who in your groups has completed the "Individual Travel Waiver" you are going to look for the "2023-2024 Individual Travel Waiver" tag in your group's member list. To do that:

- 1. Navigate to your group's "Dashboard".
- 2. Locate and select "Members".
- 3. Look underneath the member's name and email information for the "2023-2024 Individual Travel Waiver" tag. Example below.
