4 Steps to Take if Your Identity is Stolen

1. Place a fraud alert on your credit reports, and review your credit reports.

- 2. Close the accounts that you know, or believe, have been tampered with or opened fraudulently.
- 3. File a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC).
- 4. File a report with your local police or the police in the community where the identity theft took place.
