





## Windows Phone 7 Configuration for UR\_RC\_InternalSecure

{Please note that the quality of the screenshots is subject to lack of a screenshot function on Windows Mobile 7 Phone}

	<p>Before starting, ensure that you get to this standard “tiles” screen for Mobile 7. You can press the Windows logo-imprinted button usually on the bottom of the device.</p> <p>Note the arrow in upper right portion of screen. Swipe your finger from the right side of the screen to the left. This will scroll to the screen on the right. It gets intuitive.</p>
	<p>You should be at a screen where the first entry is “Alarms”. Swipe your finger from the bottom of the window upwards.</p> <p>Tap the “Settings” icon, usually at the bottom of the list.</p>

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	<p>After moving the slider, your device will tell you what wireless networks it sees. Tap on UR_RC_InternalSecure.</p>
	<p>If this is your first time connecting to "UR_RC_InternalSecure" on this device, you will be prompted for a password.</p> <p>Type the passphrase "URWireless". This is a passphrase associated with this specific wireless network. None of your passwords apply to this field. "URWireless" is case sensitive with the first three letters in upper case.</p> <p>The "Done" button will light up on the bottom left part of the screen. Tap "Done".</p>
