Phelps COLLOQUIUM



The Phelps Colloquium was founded in April 2004 by former provost Chuck Phelps. President Seligman named it in his honor when Provost Phelps retired in 2007.

The colloquium began as “Lunch with the Provost” with the simple goal of bringing members of the academic community together in a relaxed setting, to hear about research taking place campus-wide and spend time with colleagues outside their normal spheres. Provost Phelps believed this mingling would engender more cross-school and cross-discipline collaborations. Although no official data exist on whether this outcome has been realized, numerous collaborative teams credit the start of their work together to a conversation at a Phelps Colloquium.

Speakers and topics presented in the colloquium have been varied and fascinating.
