## **William L. Miller, M.D., M.A.**

**Leonard Parker Pool Chair of Family Medicine,  
Professor of Family Medicine**

Dr. Miller graduated from Wake Forest University with honors and received a master's degree in medical anthropology. After two years teaching as a secondary school teacher in Honduras to fulfill his conscientious objector obligation, he entered the University of North Carolina School of Medicine and received his medical degree in 1977. He then completed a Family Medicine Residency at Harrisburg Hospital where he served as co-chief resident. Dr. Miller entered private practice in Bethlehem, PA for four years before joining the Family Medicine faculty at the University of Connecticut. There he served as Director of Pre-doctoral Education, Residency Director, and Director of Fellowship Programs on route to becoming tenured. He returned to the Lehigh Valley in 1994 to help establish the innovative Lehigh Valley Family Medicine Residency Program and the new Department of Family Medicine. His research interests include practice improvement using complexity science, healing relationships and the clinical encounter, and professional socialization. He is one of the pioneers of qualitative and mixed method research approaches in primary care and was founding Consulting Editor for the *Annals of Family Medicine*. He is currently advisor and evaluator for the American Academy of Family Physicians' Future of Family Medicine National Demonstration Project and the national family medicine residency redesign initiative.
