

Currently undergoing a major curricular remodeling, with increased emphasis on:

- Collaborative care
- Technology in medicine
- Professional identity formation



Residency Training: Quality and Safety of Patient Care Focus

Restructuring clinical training so trainees are best positioned to succeed in tomorrow's health care settings.

- 28 Strong Memorial Hospital units integrated residents with nurses and social workers into interprofessional quality improvement teams to improve clinical quality and safety outcomes
- Launching Quality Academy to deepen the bench of clinicians trained and dedicated to quality improvement efforts



SMD Basic Science PhD Curricular Remodel

Revamped core interdepartmental courses into a single module-based course allowing for:

- o Greater use of small group-based learning
- o Increased emphasis on self-directed learning







Expanding Educational Opportunity in Oral Health

- Exploring new degree programs, including an integrated Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery/MD Program and Doctor of Dental Medicine
- Recent education-related grants:
 - HRSA grant \$3.6M aimed to train 100 dentists to be able to provide care to patients with developmental disabilities.
 - o HRSA grant \$1.M to develop curriculum in urgent care dentistry.
- 9 residency programs were reaccredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation with no citations. Their next visit will be in 2025.





Meeting the Community's Nursing Needs

- •Implementing consistent clinical nursing education across the regional affiliates, including:
 - Expanding distance-learning programs
 - 55% scholarship for RN to BS and selected MS programs
- •Growing community partnerships to increase nurse practitioner enrollment capacity in areas of identified need (ex. Mental Health).
- •For all UR Employees:
 - Will provide scholarship to offset whatever tuition benefits does not cover for:
 - >RN to BS Program
 - >Clinical Nurse Leader, MS in Nursing Education, MS in Health Care Leadership



Cross-cutting or Foundational Efforts

Institute for Innovative Education (IIE)-

- Miner Library merged with the Center for Experiential Learning under the IIE renovations continue
- ECHO tele-mentoring programs centralized under the IIE
- CEL playing key role to implement consistent clinical education and trainings across the regional affiliates

Cardiology

 - oThe only cardiac transplant service in upstate New York
 - oOne of nation's leaders in in the development of Ventricular Assist Devices (VADs) for the treatment of heart failure
 - oThe region's only Atrial Fibrillation Center providing advanced treatments that often cures atrial fibrillation permanently
 - Our rapid treatment of heart attacks is among the fastest in the nation.
