Miscellaneous

I. Bulletin

- A. The Bulletin shall be issued before the students register, and shall contain the courses to be offered in the year for which they are registering.
- B. Courses shall be listed in the Bulletin in accordance with the following regulations.

Courses shall be numbered as follows:

001-099	Non-credit courses
100-199	Introductory or basic courses; for undergraduate credit only
200-299	Courses at an advanced level, carrying undergraduate or graduate credit
300	Study Abroad
301-309	Experimental courses (offered only once)
310-388	Special courses, advanced seminars courses toward a degree with honors or distinction
389	Senior Seminar
390	Supervised Teaching
391	Independent study
392	Practicum
393	Senior Project
394	Internship
395	Independent research
396-398	
399	In <u>Absentia</u>
400-489	Master's level courses, normally taken in the first year of graduate work. (Open to undergraduates if specified or by special arrangement.)
490-499 (494)	Master's level reading or research courses Master's level practical research internships)
500-589	Advanced graduate courses; courses for Ph.D. (May be taken by undergraduates or extradepartmental graduate students only by special arrangement.)
590-599	Ph.D. reading or research courses

II. Book of Regulations
