- Jeff Runner: Jessica Guzman-Rea has been named assistant dean for diversity in AS&E, effective August 1. She continues in her role as director of the Paul J. Burgett Intercultural Center. This promotion acknowledges the need for additional human resources focused on AS&E's diversity, equity, and inclusion priorities, and recognizes the incredible value Guzman-Rea has added to AS&E through antiracism training and her many other efforts. 
