Re-Registration

Re-Registration of your student organization will begin on Monday, September 2nd at 9:00am on Campus Club Connection (CCC) and will end on Friday, September 13th at 11:45pm.

To complete the re-registration process, you will need to log-in to CCC, go to your organization's page and click on the "Register" button. You will then be taken to the re-registration form to update your officers, roster, organization profile picture, and organization profile information for the public.

Registration MUST happen 2 days in advance. No walk-ins, ALL students interested MUST report to the O'Brien Service Desk to sign up during business hours—NO phone calls. Please note the O'Brien Service Desk will be open Saturday, August 31st & Sunday, September 1st 9:00am — 9:00pm & Monday, September 2nd 12noon — 5:00pm and will allow students to signup for ALL dates. There is a 10 students minimum and no more than 25 per training. Only ONE student from each organization/club should sign up these first few weeks in order to get multiple organizations/clubs through the training.

Location: ONLY registered students should meet in the O'Brien 1st Floor Lounge and expect to go outside

With a listing in the University Events Calendar, you can use a calendar link to share online. Submit your Facebook event page to the calendar and we'll include it in the event post as well. Get even more social and use #URevents when sharing your events on Twitter and Instagram.

There are more benefits to submitting your event! Events posted in the calendar are also considered for publication in the University's daily newsletter, @Rochester and other campus publications. Events submitted three to four weeks in advance with complete details are also sent to local community calendars. Submit your event by using the online form at www.rochester.edu/calendar/?submit or submit directly to calendar@rochester.edu and include a jpeg image.

Assessment Forms

The Assessment Form serves to encourage student organizations to reflect honestly on their programs, publications, activities, and collaborations which is apart of the principles of a student organization. A thorough Assessment Form can provide invaluable direction and insight to future leadership of your organization.

The Assessment Forms are reviewed by the WCSA, IFC, and RCCL advisors in conjunction with the Mid-Year Report (collected every February) to better advocate for and serve SA organizations.
