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Register to Vote

The Committee for Political Engagement (a non-partisan, student led group convened by Rochester Center for Community Leadership) would like to ask for your help reminding your members to **register to vote**.



We believe that voting is a powerful tool students can use to lend their voice to issues that matter to them. We are asking for your help in spreading that message to your membership. Any eligible University of Rochester student can register EITHER here in Monroe County OR vote absentee in their home state.

The deadline to register in New York State is October 9th. Other state's registration deadlines can be found here: http://www.rockthevote.com/get-informed/elections/voter-registration-deadlines.html

CPE members are willing to bring voter registration forms to your next meeting. (We can provide local Monroe County forms or forms from students' home states!) If you'd like to take CPE up on this, just email uofrcpe@gmail.com. RCCL will mail any completed forms, saving you the cost of postage!

Though the scope of this year's elections are not as broad as the 2016 presidential election will be, it is vital to lend your voice to local politics. Local policies affect our lives and communities in very real ways! So, please encourage your members to speak up with their vote this November.

Important note for New York voters: If you are <u>already registered</u> to vote and want to vote in the Presidential Primary on April 19, 2016 but you are <u>not registered in the Party</u> whose primary you want to vote in, you must change your party registration by Friday, October 9, 2015.

International Education Week

This year marks the 16th Anniversary of **International Education Week** (IEW). IEW is promoted each year by the U.S. Department of State and the U.S. Department of Education as an opportunity to recognize and support the benefits of cultural exchange and international education programs. This year's theme "International Education: Advancing Access for All," celebrates the importance of global competency and education as a critical civil right, and recognizes 2015 as the 25th anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act and the 50th anniversary of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. IEW is held during the week of **November 16 - 20, 2015**.

In celebration, the College is <u>seeking submissions</u> of upcoming events from students, staff, and faculty for the entire month of November, but also for IEW. These events will be publicized on our website, Facebook page, and if the event falls during the week – the IEW Signature Poster. Online submissions are due by Friday, October 23rd.

Looking for a Form?

Did you know that frequently used forms can all be found in one place? Stop by the <u>Wilson Commons Student</u> Activities page for all your forms!

Most of the forms you will use for your organization are imbedded in the CCC. You need to log in to CCC first. The Wilson Commons Student activities page will give you the links to all the forms you need: Assessment Forms, Banner Request Form, Mid Year Report, Weekend Highlights submission, Fashionably Late Event Proposal, Flex Table Request Form, etc. just to name a few!

Accident/Injury Form

This form should be used if anyone is hurt through being involved with a student organization activity (i.e. game, practice, performance, etc.) It should be submitted within 24 hours after the incident. Find the form HERE.

Fill it out: Assessment Form

The Assessment Form serves to encourage student organizations to reflect honestly on their programs, publications, activities, and collaborations which is apart of the principles of a student organization. A thorough Assessment Form can provide invaluable direction and insight to future leadership of your organization. Best practices say complete the form NO LONGER than 2 weeks after your General Interest Meeting, event, publication, competition, etc.

CCC Monthly Tip

Now that you've gotten acquainted to the fresh, new CCC, you may have been wondering how to keep up to date on information about activities on CCC. Once you're logged into CCC, enabling this is simple: Click on your name from the top menu and select "Settings" from the list that drops down, select "Notifications" from the menu beneath the cover photo, and adjust the provided settings as desired. We suggest that you receive all notifications in your System Inbox and Email. This is especially important for the Event Registration process. Don't forget to click "SAVE" at the bottom of the page.
