Studypool has been asking student organizations to advertise for them on CCC or websites. Advertising links from businesses outside of the University of Rochester breaks University policy and it can also create breaches in security. As per the University of Rochester's Information Technology Policy: "University resources, including Information Technology Resources, may not be used for or to transmit commercial or personal advertisements, solicitations, endorsements or promotions unrelated to the business of the University."

Please work with your primary advisor on how to advertise or thank outside organizations on CCC.

At times it may be necessary to spread out posts during busy times of the year so please submit your requests early.

CCC Monthly Tip

Most students know CCC plays host to the SA Government elections, but did you know you can leverage CCC's elections functionality for your student organization. Within your student organization's page, select "Elections" and press the blue "+ CREATE ELECTION" button. Create and populate ballots with selections under the "Ballots" tab, and view result tallies under the "Results" tab. This tool can also be used for polling purposes.
