Minimum 2 months' notice. Can be up to 4 months if high-risk travel location. Please work with your primary advisor for all of your travel needs.

Leadership Challenge

Recruitment for the semester is over. Now you need to harness that energy and get the wheels spinning for the semester. Is there too much to tackle and you're feeling overwhelmed? Break it down and do it as a TEAM! There is going to be multiple things going in parallel and you want to make sure they happen and stay on track.

Remember these tips to goal setting, prioritizing time, motivating members, and effective planning:

- Review and continually update you goals at every meeting. It's okay to change your goals. You'll have reasons to fall back on and documentation of the items needed to meet the goal.
- Write out your "to do list" and then re- write it in the following order suggested by author Steven Covey and then tackle that list.
 - 1) Important and urgent

- 2) Important, but not urgent
- 3) Urgent, but not important
- 4) Not urgent and not important
- Get to know your members and determine what makes each one tick (you can divide this up amongst eboard members). Show your members you have confidence in them and that you expect them to do their very best.
- When you are planning an event use this <u>general program planning sheet</u>; check off anything you would want to do to make it the ideal program. Then ask your team, "Do we have enough time, resources, and dedicated energy to accomplish this"? If so start delegating tasks, if not re-think the program, paring it down.
