Activity Reflections

Did you know Activity Reflections are read by your Organization's advisor, the Administration and Review Committee (ARC), and most importantly incoming officers? When filling out an <u>activity</u> <u>reflection</u> form, it is important to include as many details as possible. In fact, one activity reflection form can be submitted to summarize all General Member Meetings (GMMs), rehearsals, or other ongoing semester long activities. This is one of your Organization's opportunities to share how and why your event, activity, or meeting went well or didn't. Be sure to reach out to your Organization's primary advisor if you have questions!

Springfest Weekend Planning

<u>Springfest Weekend</u> will take place **April 30th through May 2nd!** The weekend will feature a variety of traditional and reimagined events including Student Organization performances, shows, and novelties. The signature event, Dandelion Day, will be held on April 30th.

As a reminder, once your event is submitted, you will not be able to make any edits until after it has been approved. If you need to make edits while your event is "Pending Approval" please let your advisor know in the chat.

If you are submitting for a weekly or bi-weekly General Member Meeting, you should only create the first meeting and then indicate in the form that the event will be recurring. WCSA will ensure the event is set up to correctly repeat for the semester.

Rehearsal & Practice Reminders

As a reminder, all members are required to be in compliance with all COVID guidelines. Student Organizations may have different guidelines based on the type of activity. If you have questions regarding these guidelines, please contact your Organization's primary advisor.

Additionally, all event attendees must be checked in using event check-in through CCC; as well as Dr. ChatBot verified. To be Dr. ChatBot verified, attendees must show their green checkmark provided after completing that day's daily health screening.
