- Student organizations can propose one event only
- Orientation may fund a portion or all of the supplies needed for the event
- Upon submission, OFYP and WCSA will review the applications to determine which programs will be accepted with notifications going out in May 13.

Fall 2023 Orientation Performance Group Interest Form

Form Due: April 3, 2023

- Students can submit the general interest application, which will allow them to be considered for multiple "performance" events
- Based upon the group performance type, program history, and organization equity, in consultation with Wilson Commons Student Activities, OFYP will determine the best programs for each organization to participate in.
- An additional form will be required for chosen performance organizations if selected.

Officer Transition & Activity Reflections

Don't forget - a successful executive board is not only the glue which holds your organization together, but also the fuel which propels it in a forward direction. A successful officer transition is neither difficult nor very time-consuming; however, if you don't do it or do it wrong, your organization will struggler in the upcoming semester. Visit our <u>Leadership Transition</u> site to review a checklist you can use as an outgoing or incoming officer. Additionally, when removing officers in CCC, we encourage folks to use the "Active Officer" checkbox next to officer's name rather than deleting the officer entirely. This helps your organization to see the history of positions.

In addition to your officer transition, don't forget to submit your spring <u>Activity Reflections</u> before the semester ends! All activities required to be registered must have an Activity Reflection form including General Interest Meetings. While activity reflections for non-registered activities are not required, they are helpful for your organization's future officers. One activity reflection form may be submitted to summarize all General Member Meetings (GMMs), rehearsals, or other ongoing semester long activities. Not only do submitted reflection forms help your future

leadership, but they are also reviewed as part of the 2023 Student Organization Annual Review (SOAR).

Student Org Storage/Space Reminder

As we approach the end of the semester, this is a reminder that student organizations are not allowed to store personal belongings in their assigned storage or space. If any personal items are discovered in storage rooms or space allocated to your organization it will be disposed of. Prior to leaving campus this summer, make sure you have a plan to store your own personal items.

Also, if you are storing any items for your club in your room or at an off campus location, please fill out a <u>storage space request form</u> so we can get your items moved into an official on campus space.

Advanced Reservations

Advanced reservations for major events were due today by 5pm. If your organization did not submit before 5pm then you will have to wait until the template reopens this summer.
