Advance Reservations for 2025-2026

Reservation templates for the next academic year open THIS MONTH! Be sure to <u>update your Virtual EMS contact</u> before the templates open to avoid any delays. As this is a best-fit process, it does not matter if you submit your request between March 17 and May 2. If you submit a request, it will be reviewed simultaneously and with equal priority. Set your organization up for success this upcoming semester and submit your advance reservation requests! Additional information about the process will be sent to all student organization officers listed on CCC just before the break.

ECM Blackout Dates

We have seen some confusion about ECM Blackout Dates this semester. An ECM Blackout date is when ECM has hit the maximum number of events they can support on a given day. You are still able to request a reservation for a blackout date, but you will be limited to the support that you will be able to request. Need a handheld mic in a classroom with a built-in sound system? No problem! Need a full stage and strobe lights in the ballroom? No can do. Please get in touch with your advisor for additional guidance on what can or cannot be supported on a blackout date.

Finance Reminders

Business Manager Role

Business Managers are the only designated organization member who can transact with SOFO. If another member needs to transact, an Exception Form must be submitted.

Financial Transaction Request (FTR) Form Processing Time

FTRs require 2-3 business days for processing. Occasionally, forms are processed sooner, but 2-3 business days is the norm. Please do not submit an FTR and expect it to be processed the same day.

Missing Receipts

Please remember to return all receipts for any and all transactions (e.g., credit cards, Sunoco gas cards, enterprise rentals, etc.). Receipts are the only way SOFO can verify the expense. Failure to return receipts will have a negative impact on your organization's SOAR evaluation.

Shops @ WilCo

Please ensure that ALL CASH from your Shops @ WilCo sales is deposited at SOFO <u>as soon as your event ends</u>. The total event settlement cannot be finalized until the cash is accounted for. Please take a look at the complete <u>Shops @ WilCo policy here</u>. Failure to turn in the cash from your fundraiser will have a negative impact on your organization's ability to transact in the future.

The final week for Shops @ Wilco will be from March 31 to April 6.
