

Dennis Mozingo is an assistant professor in the Division of Neurodevelopmental and Behavioral Pediatrics, Department of Pediatrics. He is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst-Doctoral and school psychologist. His faculty appointment primarily includes clinical and teaching activities.

Dr. Mozingo directs the Certification Program in Autism Spectrum Disorders and Applied Behavior Analysis offered jointly by the Warner School of Education, where he is an adjunct, and the Division of Neurodevelopmental and Behavioral Pediatrics, Department of Pediatrics, School of Medicine and Dentistry. In addition to his leadership role in the Program, he teaches courses in applied behavior analysis and supervises students in practicum settings in applied behavior analysis and autism. Dr. Mozingo's clinical and community service activities include consultation to children and their families, classrooms and education professionals serving children from the early intervention to high school years, through the Strong Center for Developmental Disabilities. His research interests include early intervention in autism spectrum disorders and staff training and management in developmental disabilities service. Dr. Mozingo has been engaged in policy and legislative activities for several years, as a member of the Board of Directors of the New York State Association for Behavior Analysis, including two years as the organization's President.

Dr. Mozingo's role in leadership positions, as a "clinician-teacher" and his extensive community involvement, activities integral to the University's mission, will bring an underrepresented perspective to the Faculty Senate.
