Overview and Process

What is a limited submission?

- Funding opportunities in which the sponsoring agency limits the number of proposals (applicants) it will allow from an institution



What is a limited submission?

- Funding opportunities that require institutional space, resources, faculty appointments, etc.



Why an internal process?

- To ensure compliance with restricted number of proposals per the NOFO
- To ensure we, as an institution, are putting forward our strongest proposals



Call for Applications

- Internal
- Announced through VPR_Funding_Opps listserv and VPR website
- Contains NOFO information, award amounts, deadlines, and required internal application elements

Internal Application Process

- Complete the required internal application documents
 - Coversheet w/ basic info
 - Research abstract
 - Biosketch / CV



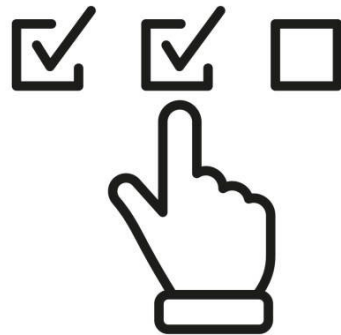
Internal Application Process

 - All other schools and MAG: Libby Reitz



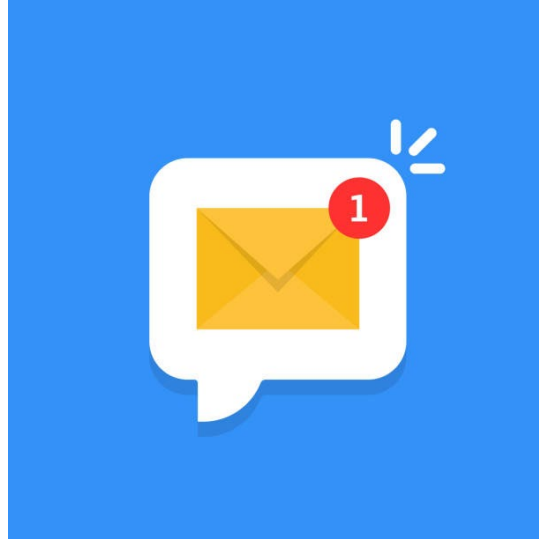
Internal Application Process

- Internal application is reviewed by Advisory Committee
- Advisory Committee selects final proposal(s)



Internal Application Process

- OVPR notifies all applicants of Advisory Committee decision



Internal Application Process

- Selected applicant(s) work with their department research administrator or dean's office research team to prepare formal proposal
 - Office of Foundation Relations is consulted as well if funding opp is from a foundation



Internal Application Process

- Selected applicant(s) submit formal proposal through IORA
- **Must indicate in IORA if a proposal is for a limited submission**

Limited submission funding opportunities are those in which the sponsoring agency limits the number of proposals (applicants) it will allow from an institution. Occasionally, certain funding opportunities that do not limit the number of proposals from an institution but require institutional space, resources, or faculty appointments (such as the NIH S10 or NSF MRI) are also treated as limited submissions. Such funding opportunities may come from federal agencies, foundations, and—in some instances—private corporations.
