OFF CAMPUS LIVING

Do not submit a housing contract if you are a junior/senior who plans to live off campus. The Office for Off Campus Living Programs (which is part of Residential Life) provides assistance, education, and support to students who are looking for housing or residing off campus. 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ELIGIBILITY

Students in the class of 2028 and 2029 are required to live on campus (residence halls, greek housing, or special interest housing). There will not be a rising sophomore release for the coming academic year.

Juniors (2027) and seniors (2026) are eligible but not required.

Take 5 and E5 are not eligible for the room selection process but can submit waitlist housing applications beginning May 1st. For assistance with off campus housing, please reach out to us at offcampus@reslife.rochester.edu.

MEDICAL ACCOMMODATIONS

Students are expected to participate in the Room Selection first to try to secure suitable housing on their own. If they are unable to do so, their accommodation request will be reviewed.

Students who may need housing accommodations due to a disability must submit a request through Disabilities Services no later than Friday, April 5th

GENDER INCLUSIVE HOUSING

Gender-inclusive housing seeks to provide an environment that is welcoming to all gender identities and is not limited to the traditional gender binary (male and female).

We recognize that same-sex room assignments are not ideal or appropriate for all students. Residential Life provides opportunities for students to live in singles in apartments and suites in mixed groups as well as any standard double room on a co-ed floor as well as double rooms in suites.

This housing option allows students to select roommates regardless of their sex, gender, or gender expression and to broadly choose from the relevant housing options. Unless specific mutual requests are made by the roommates, Residential Life will continue to assign students based on the standard gender binary (male/female). UNIVERSITY OF ROCHESTER DINING SERVICES 2025-26 MEAL PLAN OPTIONS & PRICING

All students, whether on or off campus, are required to have a meal plan for the 2025-26 academic year. Failure to select your meal plan by May 2 will result in your meal plan being defaulted to Blue Unlimited Pass Plan and a late fee. Students select their meal plan after selecting housing. To do this, the student must log back into the StarRez Portal, navigating to the Housing Application link, Term Selector page, then click Continue.

For students living on campus, the meal plan is tied to the residence hall you live in and relates to the availability of kitchens. The more kitchen facilities, the smaller the required meal plan. The fewer kitchen facilities, the larger the required plan options.

Students assigned to ADP, Psi Upsilon and Sigma Chi will be emailed the Fraternity Dining Contract to submit to Dining Services. RAs living in Residential Groups 1 & 2 will be able to select Residential Group 3 Meal Plans. D'Lions and First Year Fellows residing in Group 1 will be able to select Group 3 Meal Plans.

Pass Plans

The Unlimited Pass Plans give the user unlimited access to Danforth, Douglass and Eastman Dining Centers while the 150 Pass Plan allows for 150 entrances into these facilities. Each plan includes dining dollars to spend in any of our retail facilities, cafés and food purchases at our campus markets. Meal swipes can also be used in Grab and Go in Douglass Commons, Monday through Friday for breakfast and lunch and in the Pit after 3:30pm Monday-Friday, and all-day on weekends. Pass Plans include 10 guest meals per semester which can be used to pay for a guest at Danforth, Douglass, or Eastman Dining Center or to purchase a reusable container that can be used for take-out meals in any of our locations.

Dining Dollar Plans

All dining dollar plans are accepted at all campus dining locations on the River Campus or the Eastman School of Music and for food items in our campus markets. They are also accepted at three locations within the Strong Medical Center. Option A, B, C & C2 residential dining dollar plans come with 4 guest meals per semester.

ONLINE HOUSING CONTRACT, ROOM SELECTION & MEAL PLAN INSTRUCTIONS



Current Study Abroad Students

will receive the same information as on-campus students and must participate in the contract submission/selection process to obtain on-campus housing.

There are three steps to the housing and dining selection process:

1. The first step is to complete an on-line housing contract from 3/14-4/04/2025

**If you are living in SIH, Fraternity/Sorority, or are a RA, First Year Fellow, D'Lion and RA roommate, the deadline to submit the housing contract is 4/02/2025.*

2. The second step is to select a room on-line during your selection day and time from 4/14-4/18/2025.

3. The final step is to select a meal plan on-line by 5/02/2025.

Note: If you are living in SIH, Fraternity/Sorority, or are a RA, First Year Fellow, D'Lion and RA roommate you will not have access to the room selection since you will be assigned ahead of time, and will have early access to Meal Plan Selection.

HOUSING CONTRACT OPTIONS

The first step is to select one of the below housing contracts.



Studying abroad for the fall? You do not need to submit a housing contract and participate in room selection.

If you do, your contract and assignment will be cancelled once your plans are confirmed.

You will be emailed in November with information on how to reapply.

<p>This is a binding contract for all students who want to live on campus regardless of where they select.</p> <p>If you don't like the space you selected or you are assigned to space that you do not like, a room change request form can be filed and Residential Life would attempt to do a room change for you.</p> <p>You are not eligible to have your contract cancelled.</p> <p>Your contract is binding and remains in effect.</p>	<p>This is only an option for junior and senior students. Sophomores are not eligible for the SLC option.</p> <p>For juniors and seniors that select a SLC, and don't pick a room during the room selection, Residential Life will cancel your housing contract after the process is complete.</p> <p>SLC is a good option if you only want a specific space, like a single on the Quad or O'Brien, and want to live off-campus if those spaces are unavailable.</p> <p>If you change your mind after the contract is cancelled, you can submit a new housing contract for the waiting list for housing.</p>

FIGURE OUT YOUR STRATEGY IN ADVANCE:

- Based on last year’s drawing results, about 66% of Anderson and Wilder Towers residents are sophomores.
- Currently, 84% of the students in Brooks Crossing are seniors and 16% are juniors.
- About 63% of Hill Court residents are sophomores and 50% of Southside residents are sophomores.
- There are 200 stand alone single rooms. Most will go to seniors and juniors.
- If you are a sophomore and you want to have a single room, it’s a better bet to try for a suite or an apartment.

ROOMMATE SELECTION INFORMATION

Students have three options when it comes to roommate choices:

1. Selecting Alone
2. Random Roommate Matching
3. Selecting Identified Roommates via Name Search

1. Selecting Alone (Not In Group)

Students entering alone may select either a single or a double.

One Person Vacancies In Suites and Apartments:

Residential Life will set aside several apartments in Riverview, Maisonettes, Anderson, Wilder and Hill Court for students who wish to live in one of these areas but aren't able to fill an entire suite or apartment.

These suites/apartments will only be viewable and selectable to students who are NOT in roommate groups. For this year, the apartments and suites will be designated male, female or all gender.

2. Random Roommate Matching

For students looking for roommates, you have the ability to search for roommates ahead of your selection day/time.

To do this, on the Roommate Selection page, click the link that says "Suggest Roommates." You will be shown potential roommate matches based off the Housing Questionnaire page and can send that student a message and a Roommate Request.

After agreeing to be roommates, students must mutually select one another by sending the Roommate Request and accepting. There must be a mutual roommate request in place for each student – once they have selected you as a roommate, you will see a message that the mutual request is confirmed. You are now a roommate group.

3. Selecting Identified Roommates via Name Search

Students who intend to live with each other will need to designate roommates, suitemates and apartment mates on the Roommate Selection page by clicking the "Search Roommate by Details" link. You will need to search for the student by the screenname they provided on the Housing Questionnaire page.

Each student will need to send Roommate Requests to the other students they are interested in living with. There must be a request/acceptance in place for each student – once they have selected you as a roommate, you will see a message that the mutual request is confirmed. You are now a roommate group.

SELECTION DAYS & TIMES: April 14-18.

Rising seniors will receive the earliest days and times to select their room, followed by rising juniors and then by rising sophomores. Within class year, days and times are randomly assigned. Students will have access to all housing types at the time they select their room – depending on remaining availability and roommate designations.

Students in roommate groups who have decided they want to live together need to determine who among them has the best selection day and time. The student with the earliest day and time will need to be designated as the Group Leader on the Roommate Selection page.

The Group Leader is in charge of looking and selecting available spaces on their day/time. They will pull all confirmed students into the housing space selected and assign them to the rooms within the suite/apartment.

HOW DOES ROOM SELECTION WORK?

On students' Room Selection Day & Time, students will have access to the types of housing that fits their roommate group size, depending on remaining availability and roommate designations.

If there are no longer any available options, the student/Group Leader will need to return to the Roommate Selection page and reduce the number of students in their housing group. The remaining students will need to designate a new Group Leader.

You must have the right number of students to fill the room type that you want to select – you must have six students to fill a six person suite, four students to fill a four person apartment or suite, etc.

There is only one exception to the “must fill” rule: A single student may select a double room and the remaining space in the room will be filled by another lottery participant or during the summer.

For example, Student A (Group Leader) has a selection time of Wednesday, at 4:02pm. Students B, C, D, E and F are all confirmed roommates. At 4:02, Student A logs in and checks the 6 person suite availability in Anderson Tower. Student A selects Anderson 410 and then assigns each roommate to a specific room in the suite. Once Student A opens Anderson 410 they will have a 3 minute hold on the suite in order to assign each roommate. If not completed within 3 minutes the cart will time out and the suite will return to the selection page.

Each of the 6 students will then receive confirmation of the building and room and will be prompted to go on-line to select a meal plan appropriate to the building. Since a room has already been selected on their behalf, students B, C, D, E and F will not need to select during their own lottery time. | Meal plans must be selected individually.

SIH, FRATERNITY/ SORORITY HOUSING, RA, FIRST YEAR FELLOW, D'LIONS & RA ROOMMATES

Students who are living in SIH, Fraternity/Sorority house/floors, or as RAs, First Year Fellows, D'Lions and RA roommates are required to go through the first part of the housing contract submission (select Standard Housing Contract) and the third part of selecting a meal plan. On the Housing Questionnaire Page, students living in one of the above areas will indicate so via the drop down. Students can edit this drop down up until April 2nd.

If you are living in SIH, Fraternity/Sorority, or as a RA not in suite/apartment/center double, First Year Fellow, and D'Lion, you do NOT join a roommate group and can skip the Roommate Selection process in the coming pages.

If you are a RA in suite/apartment/ center double who has students that you want to live with or are a RA roommate, you need to do the Selecting Identified Roommate portion and also submit the Roommate Form that is provided to you upon your offer.

Failure to Select Identified Roommates by March 28 will indicate to Residential Life that you do not have students to fill the spaces. These spaces will then be opened to all students to select during the lottery.

STEP BY STEP CONTRACT & SELECTION TUTORIAL

TIPS

Be prepared to break up your roommate group of 4-6 to groups of 2 or 3 in the case a suite is not available. Your Group Leader may need to do this.

Group Leaders can be changed at anytime on the StarRez Portal by going to the Roommate Selection page.

If you are in a Special Interest Housing group, Greek group or will be an RA, First-year Fellow D'lion, or RA apartment mate you must submit an online application but the room selection process will be different. You will receive special instructions.

Remember, this is a lottery. Not everyone gets the best time and day to select your room. Rest assured that as long as you submit a standard housing contract you will have housing.

4. Housing Contract Selection Rising Sophomores are required to have a Standard Housing Contract. Rising Juniors/Seniors may select Special Limited Contract. After selecting, click Save & Continue. *If you select Special Limited Contract, but are not eligible, Residential Life will automatically change you to Standard.

Housing Contract Selection

Standard Housing Contract:

The Standard Housing Contract is a legally binding contract. All students who select Standard Housing Contract are guaranteed housing for the coming academic year.

Rising sophomores are required to live on-campus and select Standard Housing Contract.

If a student is unhappy with the selected/assigned space, they can file a room change request and Residential Life would attempt to do a room change.

You are not eligible to have your contract cancelled. Your contract is binding and remains in effect.

Special Limited Contract (rising Juniors and Seniors only):

This is only an option for junior and senior students. Sophomores are not eligible for the SLC option.

For juniors and seniors that select a Special Limited Contract (SLC), and don't pick a room during the room lottery, Residential Life will cancel your housing contract after the room lottery is complete. SLC is a good option if you only want a specific space, like a single on the Quad or O'Brien, and want to live offcampus if those spaces are unavailable. If you change your mind after the contract is cancelled, you can submit a new housing contract for the waiting list for housing.

Roommate Selection and Matching Info

Students have three options when it comes to roommate choices:

1. Selecting Alone
2. Random Roommate Matching
3. Selecting Identified Roommates via Name Search

If you are living in 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, or 9th floor in suites/apartments/center double, first floor suites, and 2000, you do NOT join a roommate group and can skip the roommate selection page.

If you are a RA in suites/apartments/center double who has students that you want to live with or are a RA roommate, you need to do the Selecting Identified Roommate portion.

1. Selecting Alone Students entering alone may select either a single or a double.

One Person Vacancies in Suites and Apartments:

Residential Life will set aside several apartments in Riverside and several suites in Anderson, Babin and 1st Court for students who wish to live in one of these areas but aren't able to fill an entire suite or apartment.

These rooms will be listed under Room Profile as "Suites with Random Roommates." For this year, the apartments and suites will be designated male, female or all gender.

2. Random Roommate Matching For students selecting alone, you have the ability to search for roommates ahead of your lottery day/time. To do this, on the Roommate Selection page, click the link that says "Search for Roommates by Roommate Profile." After filling the criteria, you will be shown potential roommates, matches and can send that student a request.

After agreeing to be roommates, students must mutually select one another. There must be a mutual roommate request in place for each student - once they have selected you as a roommate, you will see a message that the mutual request is confirmed.

After mutually selection, you will then follow the **Selecting as a Group** guidelines below.

3. Selecting Identified Roommates via Name Search: Students who intend to live with each other will need to designate roommates, subtenants and apartment mates during the application submission. This can be done by searching the student name.

Each student will designate the other students they are interested in living with. There must be a mutual roommate request in place for each student - once they have selected you as a roommate, you will see a message that the mutual request is confirmed.

If you are planning to select a single, you will not designate roommates.

Selecting as a Group

You must have the correct number of mutually selected roommates, apartment mates or subtenants to fill suites, apartments and center doubles. You must mutually request each other. (only exception one Random Suites - see below).

Once the room selection process is underway, students who have decided they want to live together need to determine who among them has the best selection day and time. The student with the earliest day and time will be able to look at remaining available spaces and pull all confirmed students into the housing space selected.

For example, Student A has a selection time of Wednesday, at 4:02pm. Students B, C, D, E and F are all confirmed roommates. At 4:02, Student A logs in and checks 6 person suite availability in Anderson Tower. Student A selects Anderson 410 and assigns them self to a specific room and each remaining roommate to a specific room in the suite.

Each of the 6 students will receive confirmation of the building and room and will be prompted to go on-line to select a meal plan appropriate to the building. Since a room has already been selected on their behalf, students B, C, D, E and F will not need to select during their own lottery time.

7. Housing Questionnaire Page On this page you are required to complete the Room Profile and Gender Questionnaire, even if you plan to live as a RA, in SIH, or in a single. The first four questions are hidden from other students. The Room Questionnaire allows you to match with other students based on preferences. Be sure to check off the Display in Roommate Search Results if you plan to live with a mutually selected roommate group.

You can edit this page at anytime before the room selection days.

THE QUAD - LOVEJOY, BURTON, CROSBY AND SAM HOUSE

Average Single = ~8' x 14' | Average Double = ~15.5' x 14'
(some variance between buildings)

While Gilbert, Hoeing and Tiernan are off limits for upperclass students unless you are an RA, D'Lion or First-year Fellow, Lovejoy (entire building), Burton, Crosby and SAM House are options for continuing students.

Students are most familiar with this set up: long corridors, communal style bathrooms, mostly double rooms and a few singles. The Quad is obviously the closest to classes, a real plus for some students. There are no elevators.



JACKSON COURT -ANDERSON, WILDER AND O'BRIEN HALL

Anderson/Wilder Suite Single = 7' x 12' | Anderson/Wilder Suite Double = ~10' x 12'
Anderson/Wilder Center Double = 12' x 12'

Located beyond Danforth Dining Center, close to Hillside. Home to many Special Interest Housing groups, Anderson and Wilder have mostly suite style setup. Suites typically contain 4 singles and 1 double. The bathrooms are shared by all six residents and is cleaned once a week by the ESW. Several suites have been modified to accommodate students with disabilities.

There are also Center Doubles. Two doubles that are joined by a shared bathroom (cleaned weekly) and have separate entrances out to the floor lobby. These rooms don't have a lounge.

O'Brien Typical Single = ~9' x 13' | O'Brien Typical Double = ~11' x 21'

O'Brien Hall is a LEED Gold certified to support sustainability. This building is 5 stories tall with the first floor devoted to a building lounge, service desk, area office, building kitchen, bicycle storage room plus three public spaces open for group use—a conference room, a music performance space and a dance rehearsal room! Each floor has a community lounge and a study room.

Floors 2-5 house students and have a mixture of singles, doubles and center doubles (shared bath) for groups of four students. There are two traditional gendered bathrooms per floor plus two individual all gender bathrooms on each floor.

There is an elevator. Each room is carpeted and double rooms have sinks. This building is air conditioned! Room rent is a bit more for O'Brien. There are limited kitchen facilities for O'Brien.

HILL COURT- CHAMBERS, FAIRCHILD, GALE, KENDRICK, MUNRO AND SLATER

Suite Single = 8' x 9.5' | Suite Double = 8' x 19'

Located next to Mt. Hope Cemetery, Hill Court has mostly 6 person suites with all singles (except the second floor suites that have 4 singles and a double) and a handful of 4 person suites (only 3-4).

All fourth floor rooms have built in lofts that actually make it seem like you have a two story room. Mattresses are placed directly on the loft deck. Each suite has a common room to itself, and some have shared balconies.

There are no elevators in Hill Court buildings

The bathroom is shared by all six (or 4 in the case of a 4 person suite) residents and is cleaned once a week by the ESW.

There are six 1 person apartments located on the first floor—2 in Chambers, 2 in Gale and 2 in Munro. They include a bedroom, living room bathroom and kitchen facilities.



SOUTHSIDE- DEKIEWIET TOWER & MAISONETTES

Large rooms = ~ 10' x 14' | Small room = ~9' x 10'

The Maisonettes (2 person apartments, juniors and seniors only), which are the small houses at the base of the two towers. They include two bedrooms (one is large and the other is on the small side). There is a furnished living room and full kitchen. The bathroom is shared.

deKiewiet has 2 and 3 bedroom apartments. The apartments don't have a common room but there is a full kitchen and a bathroom shared by apartment mates. In the 3 room apartments, there are two large bedrooms and a small bedroom. But it is a single room! Residents are on their own for cleaning and supplies – these are apartment set ups.

The walk is the same distance from Southside to Hutch as a walk from Hill Court or Jackson Court. There is bus service or shuttle to get to campus easier than if you had to walk from other areas.

BROOKS CROSSING (JUNIORS AND SENIORS ONLY)

Brooks Crossing is an apartment style building with one bedroom, two bedroom, three bedroom and four bedroom apartments. In the same style as Riverview, each bedroom has its own bathroom.

Each apartment has a living room and kitchen complete with refrigerator, stove with oven, microwave and dishwasher. The apartments are air conditioned. All rooms are carpeted

Students live on floors 2–11. There are wonderful views of the City and the river. ResNet is available in Brooks Crossing. The basement has a large programming space and kitchen in addition to a bike storage room. Laundry facilities are located in the basement. The UR Rowing team has a training facility in the basement as well.

Brooks Crossing is similarly priced to Riverview with the exception of the 1 bedroom apartments which will be priced a bit higher.

HOUSING LOCATION DESCRIPTIONS cont.

RIVERVIEW APARTMENTS- BUILDINGS A, B, C, D, E & G (JUNIORS AND SENIORS ONLY)

Room size = ~8' x 10'



Most apartments are 2 person or 4 person - there are two three person apartments that may be available. Each student has their own room and bathroom within the apartment.

Whether you have a 4 person apartment or a 2 person apartment, there is a common space (living room) and the kitchens have stoves, microwaves, refrigerators and dishwashers! There is air conditioning in each apartment for the few days you'll need it in the fall and spring.

You do need to clean your own apartment – this means the bathrooms too!

ResNet service is the same as on campus. UR Public Safety has an office in Riverview (Building F).

Many students use the Shuttle to and from campus. While it doesn't run 24/7, it covers a good portion of the daytime and evening hours until 1 or 2 in the morning. There is weekend afternoon bus service to campus.

We try to be good neighbors with the community residents who live in the neighborhood near Riverview – this neighborhood is called the Plymouth-Exchange Neighborhood (PLEX) and borders on the 19th Ward but is actually a separate neighborhood.

You can have a group 4 meal plan—save some money \$\$\$\$. While Riverview is one of the most expensive housing options, combined with a Group 4 meal plan, it becomes a good deal. Financial Aid adjusts things to cover the cost of Riverview so you don't need to worry about that.

INNOVATION SQUARE (JUNIORS AND SENIORS ONLY)

Innovation Square is located in the former Xerox Tower on Clinton Avenue in the City. Only Juniors and seniors may select apartment options in Innovation Square. This is a 9-month housing contract (not a 12 month lease) through Residential Life (May – August). There will be a mix of two bedroom and three bedroom apartments available in the lottery.

All apartments are furnished. In the three bedroom apartment, there is a room without a window.

Both two bedroom and three bedroom apartments have fully equipped kitchens (including a dishwasher, stove with oven, microwave and refrigerator) and living rooms. The 2 bedroom apartments have 1 shared bathroom and the 3 bedroom apartments have a bathroom and a half bath (toilet and sink only). Students must have 2 people to select a two room apartment and 3 people to select a three room apartment.

The housing rate will be the same as Riverview and Brooks Crossing. The Orange Shuttle line stops at Innovation Square. Parking is available on-site for an additional fee (paid directly to Innovation Square). Students in Innovation Square may select a Commuter meal plan as an option but can select any of the other meal plans as well
