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# **GIVING FEEDBACK in remote/online settings**

## SUMMARY HANDOUT

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#### **Illustrative examples:**

(S=synchronous session or F2F; A=asynchronous online or regular homework)

- A. In-the-moment feedback during a class activity (S)
- B. Teacher's collective comments on homework at start of a synch session (S)
- C. Teacher's individual written feedback on student work (A)
- D. Peer feedback on a first draft, before a grade is assigned (A/S)
- E. Peer comments on online discussions (A)

#### Key tips:

- Create first a "safe learning environment," with clear norms and expectations regarding feedback
- Be sensitive about how negative feedback is worded and communicated
- Set aside time in your schedule to provide timely feedback
- Whenever possible, assign grades only **after** the student has had the chance to make revisions in response to the feedback received
- Provide rubrics and models of past work as a form of "advanced feedback"

### Key decisions to be made (and related options to consider):

<ul> <li>WHEN to give feedback:</li> <li>Advanced (through rubrics &amp; models)</li> <li>In-the-moment, while the activity is in progress</li> <li>First draft (w/ opportunity for revisions)</li> <li>Final product (no revisions)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>WHO gives the feedback:</li> <li>Teacher</li> <li>Classmates</li> <li>Real audience</li> </ul>	Level of PRIVACY: Public & individual Public-collective Private (shared only with student) Impersonal (ex: models)	GRADING: • No grade • Effort grade • Grade after revision • Grade-no revisions allowed

- Voice recording to leave comments (VoiceThread; others)
