Five years ago, the University of Rochester joined Coursera as an institutional partner to develop and offer MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses). This early adoption followed the proclamation by the higher education media that MOOCs were going to disrupt and dramatically change universities forever. This LiDA session will explore what we have learned so far about MOOCs and what goes into making a MOOC. To guide this examination, participants will be encouraged to reflect on similarities and differences with other models of online courses.
